Online learning began Monday, March 30<sup>th</sup> for all students

This week got off to a great start with our switch to online learning! We had a few mishaps and mistakes, but our students (and teachers!) seem to be adjusting well.

Some reminders for you:

Google Classroom will be the home base for your student's learning. Each subject area will have its own "classroom" that will provide access to assignments, resources, and links. At least once per day, they should login to Google Classroom and work on academics. Each teacher has included information about more specific expectations for their class. While your child might have general assignment questions for you, they are all familiar with Google Classroom and can navigate it easily. Additionally, they should be expected to login each day and work to complete these assignments with little guidance from you.

Sixth grade teachers would like to welcome **parents of sixth graders** to join us on Wednesdays if they have any questions. You will be able to speak with all of us and we will answer/ discuss any questions you might have. All you need to do is email one of the sixth-grade teachers and set up a time from 10:00-12:00. We will put you in the schedule and you will be able to join our call, at your scheduled time, from the link found in your child's Science Google Classroom. We ask that you email us in advance, so we aren't meeting with multiple parents at one time.

2. On the left side, click on **Report Card**
3. On right side across the top, click on **View Paper Report Card**
